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



NEEV - ENHANCING FOUNDATIONAL LEARNING POST COVID

The project NEEV recognizes the significance of preschool education based on development of foundation learning among children belonging to the 0 - 6 years age group. It is a stage where they are to be introduced to new concepts, learn how to establish social interaction with others and get used to being separated from parents. Addressing the same, NEEV emphasizes on the implementation of high quality Early Childhood Care & Education (ECCE) through strengthening the capacities of Anganwadis/Balwadis in facilitating proper care and fostering an environment intrinsic to quality educational, emotional, physical and psychological growth for the children and all stakeholders involved. The Project, based in Delhi and Pune, Maharashtra, has implemented the upgradation of Balwadi/ Anganwadi centres into child-friendly ECCE centres for the provision of quality learning support to young children (0 – 6 years). Capacity building of Balwadi and Pre-School staffs and parents, especially mothers were also facilitated for delivering proper care in a safe environment in both the schools and homes for the children. Furthermore, multilingual development learning materials such as workbooks were developed, and Building as Learning Aid (BALA) art was incorporated into the entire Balwadis infrastructures to enhance visual learning among the children.

SCCD - SCHOOL AT THE CENTER OF LEARNING

The **School Centered Community Development** (SCCD) Program aims to provide quality education and create an enabling environment for marginalized children, focusing on keeping the school at the center and involving the surrounding community to bring holistic transformation. Initiated in November 2017 covering four government schools and one community in Delhi, the program has expanded to three other locations in Hyderabad, Pune, and Bengaluru. The project emphasizes student-centric interventions, community outreach, and stakeholder collaboration to create a supportive ecosystem for the development of children and the community as a whole and aims to empower students as catalysts for change.

The life cycle approach of the program consists of three components: early childhood care and development, enhanced learning outcomes for students, and youth engagement as active citizens. The program covers 40 schools, 59 Anganwadi Centres, and 4 Youth Resource Centres, impacting a total of 24,279 students/youth and involving 276 teachers

YOUTH RESOURCE CENTRE

Youth Resource is a pivotal player in which revolves our mission around unleashing the latent capabilities of India's youth. We tackle this endeavor through a multifaceted approach encompassing Life Skills development, Social Initiatives, Mentoring programs, Leadership Remediation, Academic support, and various other avenues. In essence, YRC is not merely a center; it's a catalyst for change, a platform for India's youth to flourish, and a conduit through which they can contribute to their communities and beyond.

IDIA - FROM EDUCATION TO IDEATION FOR SUCCESS

The Integrated Development through Innovative Approach (IDIA) program is aligned with United Way Delhi's School Centered Community Development (SCCD) program. The program envisages a school environment that is conducive to learning which requires investments at multiple levels. Under the program, it is mandated to set up digital classrooms at 3 Government Middle Schools in project locations to supplement teaching through digital support. Youth Resource Centres (YRCs) function as key pillars to the program, ensuring as a platform with a safe environment for learning. Through remedial classes, life skills and vocational trainings, digital and financial literacy, sports, arts and culture activities etc., the youth are engaged to freely enjoy, experience, learn, explore, grow and discover potentials, capacities and confidence, enabling them to make choices for their higher education, career paths and discover themselves.




TINKERING LAB

A tinkering lab project supported by AMD INDIA Private Limited was implemented in the Government Senior Secondary School at Hazipur, Sohna, Gurugram (Haryana). It aimed to improve the conceptual and practical learning of the students by organizing various classes related to Tinkering Lab. The lab is equipped with state-of-the-art Science & Tinkering models and equipment along with DIY Kits to reach out to a maximum number of students in the school. The focus is on conducting experiential learning and introducing Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Robotics concepts through trained mentors periodically.

DIGITAL & SMART CLASSROOMS

A digital classroom project supported by AMD INDIA Private Limited was implemented in two schools in Sohna block in Gurugram district (Haryana). The program aimed at strengthening the education system through promoting STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and experiential learning among students by means of a canvassed STEM Education and Digital Classroom. It also aimed to improve the conceptual and practical learning of the students by organizing various classes related to STEM education.

Additionally, a smart classroom project was implemented in four Government schools of Sahibabad, Ghaziabad district (U.P). A smart classroom is an EdTech-upgraded classroom that enhances the teaching and learning process for both the teachers and the students by inculcating usage of audio, video, animations, images, multimedia etc. This increases the engagement factor and leads to better-performing students. Approximately 2165 students would be benefitted through these smart class classrooms.

THE ROAD TO FINANCIAL STABILITY WITH UNITED WAY DELHI...

"I usually shied away from asking for help, fearing rejection. United Way's Project Sanriddhi has taught me self - respect and confidence. Instead of shying away, I channeled my energy into stitching and altering clothes. This created a loyal customer base, and soon, word-of-mouth transformed into my greatest publicity tool. As time flowed, curious girls approached me for stitching lessons, gradually evolving into my trainees. This not only boosted my income but also offered me valuable assistance. With just one sewing machine, I'd cut the fabric and pass it to them for stitching, allowing me to manage other tasks simultaneously.

With both space and a devoted clientele, I capitalized on clothing opportunities. Whenever stitching or alteration requests came in, I sweetened the deal by offering a readymade piece at a more affordable rate than the market. By keeping a mental tab on competitors' prices and selling my product at a slightly lower cost, I implemented a strategy that lured customers in and kept them coming back for more. My life has changed completely since joining Samriddhi , and I wish to support United Way Delhi to support more women towards the path of re-discovering themselves and reaching a point of financial independence and stability."

WE LEAD: CAPACITATING LIVELIHOODS FOR FINANCIAL STABILITY

Program 'WELead' aimed at ensuring sustainable livelihood of women through engaging them in upskilling and strengthening for entrepreneurship they aspire for and earn for meeting their needs. The project overall aims to:

- Map aspiring women entrepreneurs and capacitate them in their journey towards establishing sustainable livelihoods
- Facilitate financial and digital literacy skills along with improvising knowledge for business development and management among future women entrepreneurs

SAMRIDDHI: PAVING THE WAY FOR WOMEN IN ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Project Samriddhi, initiated in 2016, empowers women from poor households in Delhi's Kapashera community. It provides digital financial and business knowledge, personalized leadership support, and helps women start and grow businesses. Over the five years, Samriddhi has benefited 3560 women, enabling 181 aspiring women to start successful ventures and improve their livelihoods.

JOVT - UNLOCKING POTENTIALS, BUILDING CARREERS

The **Job Oriented Vocational Training** program project aims to skill and train unemployed youth to provide them with livelihood support through employability access in the healthcare sector. It implements healthcare/soft skills and employability training in Vocational Centres across 13 states with the overall commitment to impart valuable skills to 6900 youth within a period of 2 years. Youth from low – income households were mobilized and targeted under this program to join the course for post – career guidance and counselling sessions.

IRDP - BUILDING STRONG AND RESILIENT COMMUNITIES

United Way of Delhi envisaged an integrated project approach titled as '**Integrated Rural Development Project**' (IRDP) incorporating COVID-19 response, rehabilitation of people affected by COVID-19, the need to adopt an integrated development approach to improve the environmental conditions of people, health, and livelihood of the people impacted by COVID-19. The project was implementated in 10 villages in the Sohna block of Gurugram district. The key focus was to improve the environmental and livelihood conditions of underprivileged sections of society. Supported by United Way Worldwide and Hitachi India, the project enhanced and sharpened the skills of the people affected by COVID-19 to have livelihood opportunities, enabling them to improve their standard of living. Moreover, the program also had a sharp focus to take on challenges for contending pandemic and post pandemic situation.

ENGAGEMENT & INNOVATION IMPLEMENTATION & ACTION



LET'S HEAR KITABO'S STORY

Amidst the backdrop of responsibilities and challenges, Kitabo's life unfolded like a story of relentless perseverance. Armed with only the most basic education, she bore the weight of an ailing husband and two young children who were not yet equipped to manage the complexities of family life. In a quest to meet the most basic needs, Kitabo embarked on a journey of hardship. With a husband earning daily wages, their income couldn't suffice for their children's education. Acknowledging the need to augment their resources, Kitabo stepped up to provide for her family. Armed with an old hand-sewing machine and limited knowledge of blouse stitching, she set out on her path as a tailor. However, the journey was far from smooth, with a significant portion of her earnings earmarked for her husband's medical needs. This financial strain forced her daughter to halt her education, while Kitabo rented a shop at a monthly expense of Rs. 6000 to continue her business.

Three years passed in this struggle, with Kitabo relying on the old sewing machine for alterations and blouse stitching. Post Project Samriddhi's arrival in the community, a friend introduced her to Samriddhi's initiative of providing sewing machines to women. Amid doubts and concerns, Kitabo's determination led her to explore this opportunity. While uncertainties clouded her mind, she couldn't deny the potential this opportunity held. The prospect of undergoing better training and skill enhancement offered under Samriddhi fueled her dreams, erasing her scepticism. As she embraced the training offered by Samriddhi, she discovered new horizons. Designing Palazzo pants and Petticoats became her newfound skill. Beyond stitching, Samriddhi's sessions encompassed business growth, financial literacy, savings, and women's empowerment. These learnings seeped into her life, fueling her business expansion and aiding her in managing her finances.

Through the project, she received a new and advanced sewing machine which elevated her skills and productivity, doubling her income. With regular and new customers flowing in, she found herself in demand. This newfound success also paved the way for her daughter's marriage, a dream she could realise through dedicated savings and her husband's support. As she continued to juggle her personal and professional life, she wove her aspirations into reality, owning a plot and constructing a home in Najafgarh.

However, life's uncertainties didn't wane. Despite her achievements, her husband's health remained a challenge. As his medical expenses surged, her earnings dissipated. Yet, she pressed on, commuting from Najafgarh to Kapashera during the lockdown, ensuring her family's needs were met. Through her tireless dedication, her business became the family's sole breadwinner.

As her journey unfolds, Kitabo embraces determination and hard work as her guiding stars. With a steadfast gaze on the future, she envisions a shop filled with an array of fabrics, laces, and more. Her aspirations remain unbound, and she voices her request for an additional interlock machine from Samriddhi. In the tapestry of her life, Kitabo is a testament to how resilience and dedication can weave a fabric of success even in the face of challenges unknown.

LONG TERM RESILIENCE BUILDING

BUILDING RESPONSE, RECOVERY, REHABILITATION AND RE-BUILDING POST COVID



The Covid 19 Response, Recovery, Rehabilitation and Re-Building Program provides quality of health services including mental health services for economically disadvantaged populations through accessible and affordable facilities in the community. Based on the outcomes of community health assessment activities and community health improvement processes, a comprehensive community health improvement plan was a long-term, systematic attempt to address public health issues. With support from Macarthur Foundation, United Way Delhi team aided in providing multiple facilities to communities, such as:

- Critical Pulmonary Care Support & Public Health Awareness Media Development
- Covid Cold Chain Support & Health on wheels (Swasthya Vaahini)
- Enhancing the capacities of grass-root healthcare centres in post-covid health systems and management
- Access to quality mental health support (especially in the post-COVID scenario) for underserved communities





A UNITED FIGHT TO STOP TB

United Way Delhi is taking proactive steps to raise awareness about tuberculosis (TB) and its prevention in the National Institute of Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases (NITRD) dispensaries located in Jaunapur and Mehrauli. Through the interventions of health check-up camp with the support from NITRD medical staff, wall art, awareness materials, technical app etc. the project takes on a comprehensive approach in uniting for the prevention of TB.



SVASTI – A MENTAL WELLBEING INITIATIVE OF UNITED WAY DELHI: FACILITATING WELL BEING FOR ALL

Committed to promoting mental wellbeing, fostering a supportive and inclusive environment and advocating equitable access to high quality mental wellbeing awareness to all, SVASTI, an initiative by United Way Delhi, focuses on three sections:

- The School Mental Health Initiative (SMHI)
- Community Mental Health Initiative (CMHI)
- National Consultation on Mental Health

PRIORITISING WELL BEING IN SCHOOLS

The **School Mental Health Initiative (SMHI)** was conceptualized with the focus on providing mental health services encompassing preventive and primitive measures for students from Grades 6th to 12th, whilst also simultaneously engaging with the well-being of teaching staff. The project aims to recognize student's emotions and feelings and support them to express them in a healthy manner. Through the newly introduction of a mobile health van, the project further envisions to connect students needing help to specialized mental healthcare centres as well as sensitize school teachers and staff to identify and address mental well-being with the students.

PRIOTISING WELL BEING IN THE COMMUNITY

The goal behind the **Community Mental Health Initiative (CMHI)** is to create a replicable model for facilitating to and expanding mental wellbeing services for women belonging to marginalized and underserved sections of society.

A National Consultation on Charting a Roadmap for post covid Mental Health Services IN INDIA

The National Consultation served as a platform for ongoing discussions and endeavors to address the ever-evolving challenges in mental well-being. With time, SVASTI envisions to evolve into a bi-annual deliberation, gathering experts and stakeholders to explore emerging issues and sustain progress in the realm of mental well-being. By embracing collaborative efforts, continuous dialogue, and evolving strategies, the nation endeavors to create a brighter future where mental well-being is accorded the attention, care, and resources it deserves.

The consultation sought to delve into two key areas of concern: understanding the social and mental vulnerabilities faced by women, youth, the elderly, and children, and improving mental health issues within the workplace, with a specific focus on unorganized sector workers. India, a country confronted with the daunting challenges posed by mental health disorders, has embarked on innovative initiatives to address this pressing issue. One noteworthy endeavor is the National Mental Health Program, launched in 1982. At its core, this program employs a decentralized approach to mental well-being service delivery, primarily through the District Mental Wellbeing Program established in 1996.

To enhance the overall accessibility and affordability of mental well-being services and foster well-being, the Unified Working Group on Mental Health and Development (UWD) organized a collaborative one-day consultation. This event, conducted in partnership with the Principal Scientific Advisor to the Government of India (PSA) and the National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS), brought together a diverse panel of experts from government agencies, civil society organizations, and industry.

CLEANER AIR, GREENER GURUGRAM : UNITED FOR AIR

The 'United for Air' campaign commenced in the year 2018 with the vision to engage citizens of Gurugram through awareness on the current air quality in order to generate impactful environment consciousness for clean air and greener Gurugram. The campaign engages with the public through various community engagement activities and events aligned with its vision at venues such as Schools, Colleges, Resident Welfare Associations (RWAs), Government, Corporate offices etc. . It focuses on reporting the air quality in Gurugram by means of a mobile application, a dedicated website and on-road LED panels, which display real time PM2.5 & PM10 levels of selected localities in Gurugram city. Social media handles like Facebook, Twitter & Instagram connect with the audience on larger platforms.

CONNECTING COMMUNITIES TO SUSTAINABILITY

Connecting communities to sustainability is an ongoing process that requires collaboration, education, and a commitment to long-term environmental and social well-being. Sustainability involves meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs. By working together and taking meaningful actions, communities can play a significant role in building a more sustainable future. United for Air promotes sustainability education in schools and communities to raise awareness about environmental issues, climate change, and sustainable practices and organizes workshops, seminars, and information campaigns to educate community members about sustainable living.

CYCLOTHON TO STAND UNITED FOR AIR

Cycling is a sport that not only keeps people healthy and motivated but is also an eco-friendly way to commute. The UFA cyclothon covered a distance of 6 kilometers from Saini Khera Point to Tau Devi Lal Biodiversity Park, Gurugram, Haryana. Citizens ranging from different age - groups, from across the entire Delhi NCR region participated in the event, thus strengthening the event's objective towards sensitizing today's generation to partake in our mission for standing United as one striving to have cleaner and healthier air for all.

More than 450+ cyclists contributed towards 225 + percent reduction in carbon emissions on 25th February, 2023. The route for the cyclothon was well aligned with Air Monitors displaying real-time PM 2.5 and PM 10 status of air quality.

IGBC GREEN YOUR SCHOOL – A GREEN VISION FOR A SUSTAINABLE TOMORROW

The IGBC Green Your School is an annual program open to schools across India where the various and diverse schools are encouraged to discover and come up with innovative as well as sustainable ideas for improving and converting their existing school ground into an Environment Compatible Campus, a.k.a., Green School Campus. This program helps in the reduction of the carbon footprint generation of the schools, along with educating the students, the nation's future generation, on eco-friendly practices for protecting and caring for their environment and green surroundings.

TIDY TRAILS: THINK GREEN, GO GREEN

Tidy Tails a UWD Flagship aims at effective management of post - consumer plastic waste. This initiative has been launched in Mathura and Vrindavan to encourage people to keep their local environment clean and foster 'tidiness', thereby setting good examples and inspiring other communities to follow. Waste segregation bins are installed at the shops and establishments. A dedicated van goes around the shop stretches in the city to collect the plastic. Community awareness and sensitization events are also held on regular basis to build the capacity of citizens as Tidy trails ambassadors.

SOLAR ELECTRIFICATION IN 20 PUBLIC SCHOOLS

United Way Delhi's School Support Program works on various components associated to enhance the overall environment of learning within a school campus. It aims at creating an enabling ecosystem for the children in their schools and offers the most suitable environment in terms of infrastructure and other facilities necessary for arriving at a child's proper physical and emotional wellbeing and development. PNBHFL Shifting to alternative sources of energy being the key to a sustainable tomorrow, United Way Delhi's solar electrification program is committed to the cause. Under the program, solar electrification including solar panels, wiring and other related equipment were installed at 20 government schools 4 Anganwadi Centres. The Schools were equipped 20KW Hybrid PV Solar Power Set – Up and the Anganwadis were equipped with 5KW Set – Up.

SOLAR PANEL INSTALLATION IN SCHOOL

Under the initiative of UWD's School Support Program, with support from AMD, the campus of a Government school is equipped with a 5Kw Hybrid PV Solar Power Setup. This would serve as a backup power source in times of load shedding and replace the utilization of conventional electricity for the operation of facilities dependent majorly on electricity, such as smart classroom, computer & STEM lab etc. This will also implement a sustainable and productive environment for the children to acquire more knowledge and insight on solar energy as a resource towards a green and eco – friendly future.

DISASTER RESPONSE - SAFE DRIVING AND RIDING TRAINING PROGRAM

Delhi has the highest number of fatal accidents among all cities across the country, with five deaths per day. The share of fatal road accidents has increased phenomenally as Indian cities are giving more importance to high-speed roads for vehicles – and not to ensuring (Safe Driving) safe access for all. Violation of rules - signal jumps, drunken driving and over-speeding is also rampant in the city. As per the statistics compiled by the Research Wing of the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways in its report titled 'Road Accidents in India 2022', Delhi had the highest number of deaths due to road accidents that counting up to 2,300.

With the purpose to address the issue, the project named 'Four Wheels, One Life' was implemented in Delhi NCR with the support from United Way of Mumbai and it targeted to 18+ College goers and RTO license applicants. Awareness regarding Road safety for the driver licensing and training improved the competence and capability of drivers. Promotion of public safety by imparting road safety training among college youth and learning license applicants in Delhi were also relevant beneficiaries under the program.

SHORT TERM RESILIENCE BUILDING POST COVID

SUPPORT TO TRAFFIC FORCES

United Way Delhi and 3M teamed up to provide 150,000 Disposable Particulate Respirators to the Traffic Department in Gurugram as part of their ongoing efforts to support frontline workers amidst the rising pollution levels and deteriorating air quality in the region. This alliance aims at aiding the personnel on-duty function better with lesser respiratory risks. The provision of respiratory masks significantly contributed towards the safety and protection of the personnel in the frontline forces as while on the field, they are in vulnerable environment exposed to harmful particulate matter. This initiative underscores 3M's commitment to public health and safety and United Way Delhi's efforts to support the community in these challenging times.

CAPACITATING HOSPITAL INFRASTRUCTURE

In continuation of UWDs ongoing efforts for building post-Covid resilience in communities, we joined hands with Synchrony to support the capacity building of Diagnostic Services at Indira Gandhi Hospital, Dwarka, New Delhi. An advanced high-frequency 500mA X-ray machine along with a digital CR System and a Spirometry machine were installed at the Radiology and Pulmonary departments respectively. The machines, free of cost to use, will support the medical infrastructure of the hospital post covid, primarily for poor and underserved sections of society. More than 1500 OPD patients are diagnosed and overall 3000+ individuals are benefited from the machines per month.



VEDANTA DELHI HALF MARATHON 2022

Through word of mouth, she started to receive a few orders each day, though the income was barely enough to make ends meet. Her breakthrough came when she learned about the 'Samriddhi Project' from a woman she referred to as her "angel." Kapashera, a hub for apparel and manufacturing, became Chandni's opportunity to thrive. She joined the Samriddhi Project as a beneficiary and received training in business development, management, and financial literacy. Starting with a traditional sewing machine, she gradually incorporated modern, technology-enabled equipment, significantly boosting her productivity. Today, Chandni owns a successful boutique, has hired an assistant, and received financial support from the Samriddhi Project. Her monthly income has grown from 3,000 to 15,000 and even more during festival and wedding seasons. She now uses online platforms like Paytm, Phonepe, and Google Pay to manage orders and payments, and her clients are satisfied with her work. Chandni's story is a testament to her resilience and the transformative power of the Samriddhi Project, which helped her rise from adversity to success.

LEDs displaying real-time AQI to be installed in Delhi-NCR

A s part of its 'United for Air' initiative, Carrier India will install LED display boards across Delhi-NCR which will display real-time air quality index and suggest ways to tackle air pollution. Starting its campaign, the company has installed 17 LED display boards in key locations in Gurugram.

"Carrier India continues to expand United for Air, a corporate social responsibility (CSR) initiative designed to educate and bring communities together to work for cleaner outdoor air. Carrier plans to install additional air monitors and LED display boards to make real-time data accessible to more residents of Gurugram. It will take this initiative to other locations of Delhi-NCR soon," said a statement.

These boards will display



air quality on the basis of data collected from air quality monitors installed in the nearest location. The company has installed eight such air quality monitors in collaboration with Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority.

The air quality monitors connect with LED boards that display real-time PM2.5 and PM10 levels, along with recommendations such as 'Go for an evening walk' and 'Do yoga outdoors' when conditions are good, and 'Wear masks' and 'Avoid strenuous activities' when pollution levels are high.


