Towards betterment for the 0-6 age group, United Way Delhi's Neev is aligned to United Way World Wide's flagship Born Learning program and is being implemented through Anganwadis & Nursery Classrooms to build a strong foundation for the development of the children in their most formative years of growth. The program is in operation in geographies including Delhi, Gurugram, Noida, Rudrapur Uttarakhand, Hyderabad & Bangalore.

Program Components

Our flagship program NEEV focusses on ensuring school readiness of children between 0-6 years of age by providing a safe and conducive environment at Anganwadi Centers (crèches) and nursery classrooms in geographies including Delhi, Gurugram, Noida, Rudrapur, Uttarakhand, Hyderabad & Bangalore.

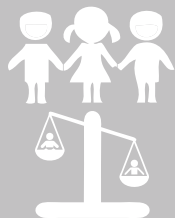



UNITED FOR YOUTH SUCCESS

United Way Delhi strongly believes that young people have tremendous potential, which if harnessed to advance the common good, can bring a positive transformation in the lives of the many! Towards our goal of enabling the youth to achieve their full potential through the means of contextual interventions in the fields of education, health, skill-building, life skills, sanitation & hygiene, and more for them to develop holistically and become change-makers of the society.

OUR PROGRAM

SCCD

The School Centered Community Development (SCCD) Program aims to enable holistic development for the community through the interventions at different levels. Components including School Support program and Karvaan Youth Resource Centre contributes towards the holistic development for youth across 34 Primary and Secondary schools in Delhi-NCR, Hyderabad, & Bangalore to achieve a better quality of life.

COMPONENTS OF SCCD - SCHOOL SUPPORT PROGRAM

School Support Program aims to strengthen the infrastructural conditions of the school and enhance the quality of learning for the students and enable optimum physical, mental and emotional growth.

KARVAAN YOUTH RESOURCE CENTRE

It is a platform for youth to blossom as leaders and mentors in their community and take field level action on local issues of relevance and become socially responsible citizens.

STEM ON WHEELS

Our STEM on Wheels program operates through an Exhibition Van, equipped with 80 plus models of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) education, which is leveraged to deliver STEM – hands on learning sessions with schools & community children and youth.

The STEM models are mapped with basic concepts of Science and the project aims to improve STEM learning in the selected schools in communities among multiple stakeholders like Schools-Heads, Teachers, Govt. Education Department, NGOs, Community Members, SMCs etc.

SANKALP

Our scholarship program aims at assisting hardworking and meritorious students from the age of 14 to 22 years, belonging to financially backward background with financial aid for pursuing academic or professional courses.

UNITED FOR HEALTH

Health is an integral component of the projects running under different domains in United Way Delhi. Access to proper drinking water, sanitation and hygiene in schools is a need of the hour. The school infrastructure plays a major role in providing a safe space for the overall development of children. Lack of these facilities is a major concern for children dropping out of government schools, particularly girls.

OUR PROGRAM

WATSAN (Water & Sanitation)

School infrastructure is one of the most important component for children studying in government schools across India. Lack of proper water & sanitation facilities in the schools results in dropout of children, especially girls, impacting their education and career. Appropriate sanitation facilities in schools provide the basis of a healthy learning environment.

Our WATSAN project is focuses on two inter-related segments:

- a) Focuses on providing PORTA Toilets to each school according to their requirements and
- b) Ensuring sustainability through behavioural change among key stakeholders including school staff, students, SMC members and the community.

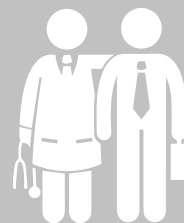



UNITED FOR FINANCIAL STABILITY

United Way Delhi supports women and young adults from financially disadvantaged households to empower them to build a better quality of life for themselves and their families. Through the means of professional skill building and business development support, we aim to economically empower them to achieve their full potential through means of financial stability.

OUR PROGRAM

SAMRIDDHI

Aimed at economically empowering women belonging to financially underprivileged households, United Way Delhi's Samriddhi program focuses on addressing the livelihood problems through engaging women in production based income generation activities and providing business development support.

Project Samriddhi is being implemented in the Kapashera and Sultanpur region of Delhi-NCR, impacting over 156 women.



HUNAR

The program seeks to maintain and increase the capacities of young adults to support themselves and to contribute to the well-being of those around them by creating an enabling environment for economic and social empowerment.

Under the Hunar project, we are working with the youth from underprivileged communities in Khora slum of Ghaziabad, impacting over 1000 adolescent and youth with 60% girls.

By raising awareness in the community, we work towards maintaining cleaner air with a conscious effort to reduce our individual and institutional carbon footprint.



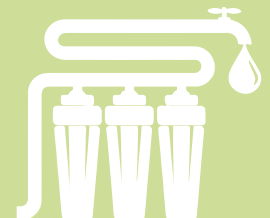
GREEN YOUR SCHOOL

Aimed at incorporating the component of sustainability and environment in the project, in Pune beside our flagship School Support Program, we have also built a Check Dam to ensure easy access of water to the children in the school and the community.

UNITED FOR DISASTER RESPONSE

United Way Delhi with the aim of providing relief to the affected families of Delhi Riot in the North East region of Delhi which escalated over time. As a result of the violence, 50+ deaths had been confirmed during the time of intervention, including the death of a police officer, with over 1000+ physically injured and thousand other families put to mental trauma. Displaced families stayed at the relief camps or makeshift shelter spaces.

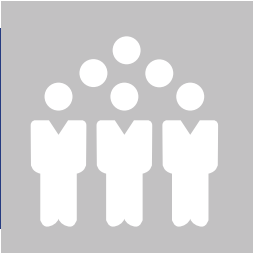

UNITED AGAINST COVID-19



COVID-19 is a respiratory illness caused by a newly discovered coronavirus, it has spread to more than 190 countries and territories. United Way Delhi is working towards introducing measures to prevent its spread across 5 States including Delhi, UP, Haryana, Uttarakhand, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra. To increase the capacity of healthcare frontline workers and building capacity of hospitals managing positive cases. With efforts to prevent community transmission of COVID-19 and sustaining poor & vulnerable families being a top priority, United Way Delhi provided immediate relief to daily wage workers, vulnerable section of the society.



CORPORATE VOLUNTEER ENGAGEMENT

United Way Delhi engages volunteers across projects for multiple causes. Mobilizing volunteers from corporates, government bodies as well as partner NGOs are a regular thing on the UWD schedule.







Responding to the call given by Honorable Prime Minister Narendra Modi against the single-use plastic, United Way and its partners pledged support for the cause and participated in the India Plog Run across 50+ cities in the country. In the Delhi leg of the event, 1500+ ploggers participated at multiple locations with Lieutenant Governor of Delhi, Sh. Anil Baijal flagging off the event along with Delhi Commissioner of Police, Sh. Amulya Patnaik on 2nd October. Similar events were conducted in schools of Delhi NCR as well.

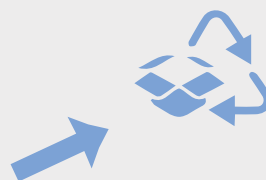

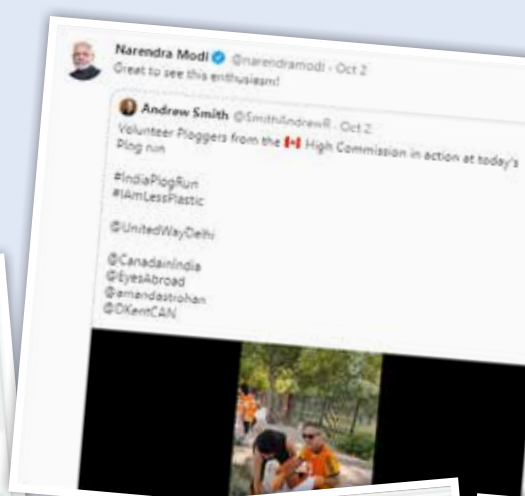

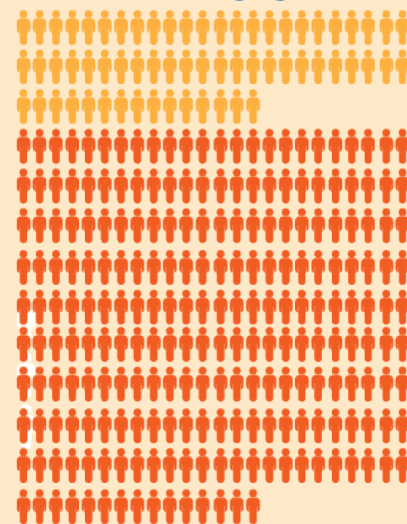
