Livelihood

United Way Delhi strongly advocates the promotion of women's economic independence. Financial literacy and vocational training constitute the programs channelized towards women empowerment.

Disaster Response

“ I am Pallavi, 12 years old girl, the youngest, in a family of five living in Chakkarpur. My parents work as housekeepers barely meeting the ends. When teachers from the Humana People to People India came and counselled my parents on the importance of education, they agreed and enrolled me under PEHAL girl initiative.

Initially I was nervous but in the friendly environment got opportunity to explore my hidden talents such as drawing, singing, dancing, sports etc. **PEHAL project** has helped build my **confidence** and **learn the virtues of punctuality, regularity, discipline** and **team work**.

I have been mainstreamed in 5th class of Government School at Chakkarpur, and attend the PEHAL girls session. I am thankful to the project staff for changing my life.

“ I am Priti, aged 20 years, living in Begaumpur slum. My father, an auto-driver was unable to pay for my higher studies and wanted me to marry. Fortunately, i joined computer literacy class under UMANG project and got placed in India Mart with a salary of 12000/- per month. Within a month I got promoted to floor manager, and now want to complete my Graduation and join administrative services. **I owe my confidence and job opportunity to UMANG.**

Today I can afford to join a good coaching institute and realise my dream of becoming an officer. My family is proud of me and my younger sister too is inspired to continue her studies.

Programmes Highlights 2015-16

Pehal

Community Development Program

PEHAL seeks to provide holistic development of the migrant families inhabiting resettlement/ slum clusters in Chakkarpur village, with access to health care, education and basic civic amenities, such as toilets and bathrooms.

Initiated in 2013, through persistent efforts of project staff and proactive participation of community members, hygiene and sanitation conditions have improved considerably. Healthcare awareness and accessibility enhanced when the project opened an evening clinic offering OPD and referral services. Women health clubs were created to spread awareness on important health issue. Education support has mainstreamed many students and dropout rates have considerably gone down. Empowerment through vocational training and job fairs has resulted in securing livelihoods.

School Support Program

United Way Delhi's School Support Program with its high impact and massive outreach has been designed to help government schools and schools run by non-profit agencies for marginalized children in Gurgaon, Delhi and Ghaziabad.

The range of activities spans across improving physical, learning and social environment. Some of the major activities already initiated in the program include construction, renovation of Water and Sanitation facilities in schools, Repair and supply of new furniture in schools, Revival and activation of SMCs in schools and spread of awareness about Sanitation issues among beneficiaries through campaigns/sessions.

Umang

Girls Empowerment Program

Umang Project provided support to ensure holistic development of adolescent girls in the formal education system through remedial coaching, vital life-skills, vocational training and career counselling. Launched in September, 2013 at Jagdamba Colony in Malviya Nagar, Umang was well received by the community. Providing school bags and bicycles, educational excursions, theme-based workshops, health camps, self-defence camps all added to the value of learning experience offered. A total of 1090 girls got enrolled in the program by the end of six months. Effort has resulted in improved school performance, employability and comprehensive progress.

Swavlamban

Community Development Program

A community development initiative aimed to build self-reliant communities through targeted interventions in the areas of Education, Health, Women Empowerment and Financial inclusion, was implemented in Kapashera Village and Sangam Vihar. Out-of-school children were mainstreamed, remedial education provided in schools, vocational training offered to youth and women. Health clinics offering OPD and referral services. Additionally, a help desk service offering registration services for UID, Pan cards, Labour cards and opening of bank accounts was set up.

Science Centre

Innovative educational tools to promote practical and experiential learning are employed to promote science literacy and a spirit of inquiry among underprivileged students at the primary level. The program continues to benefit target beneficiaries significantly as evidenced by their improved scholastic performance and enhanced self-confidence. Camps, mobile science labs, special teacher training modules and science fair has considerably improved student participation, comprehension levels and inquisitiveness.
